Last October, Mission Fed served as the title sponsor for the 2019 BBB *Torch Award for Ethics*. Mission Fed had an opportunity and sent a message to the San Diego community that ethics are critically important and matter in all aspects of business and life. Mission Fed believes core and noble values are at the center of every organizational culture, and there was no more appropriate way to model and mentor a values-based business orientation than to partner with the BBB.

Over **264** students from **75** high schools in San Diego, Orange, and Imperial Counties submitted entries.
